HOMEWORK POLICY

RATIONALE

We believe homework is an important part of a child's education. It is set for the following reasons.

- 1. To consolidate or extend material taught at school.
- 2. To allow students the chance to think and work by themselves.
- 3. To assist in the development of positive study habits.
- 4. To allow parents to view and be involved with their child's school work.
- 5. Is at the discretion of the classroom teacher to set homework.

RECOMMENDED HOMEWORK

 Children in the Junior Primary Class are only expected to do homework if additional practice is required in a curriculum area. It is however expected that a routine of regular reading at home be monitored throughout the Early Years. In the main homework usually focuses on nightly reading. 	 Homework will be set on a regular basis. No more than 3 nights of 30 minutes work per night (this includes a routine of regular monitored reading at home). 	Students in Year 7 are likely to spend 1 hour on a maximum of 4 nights per week. They may choose to do this in a block over 1 or 2 nights depending on other commitments.

- 2. If your child/children reaches the maximum time set (30 mins) and have not completed the homework, please provide a note in their diary. We do not wish for students to work longer than the recommended time.
